LANGUAGE ARTS

H -Honors courses cover essentially the same topics and skills as regular classes but at higher levels of complexity, greater depth, and a faster pace. The reading level is higher and more reading will be required. Students will be required to use a higher level of vocabulary, do more writing, do more homework, and meet the standards of more challenging tests. Honors courses are recommended for students with either an average English grade of at least a C or enrollment in AVID. Summer reading is required and students should be prepared to take a test on those works as soon as the term begins.

AP-Advanced Placement courses involve higher levels of complexity, greater depth, and a faster pace. The reading level is higher and more reading will be required. Students will be required to use a higher level of vocabulary, do more writing, do more homework, and meet the standards of more challenging tests. Advanced Placement courses are recommended for students with either an average English grade of at least a C or enrollment in AVID. Summer reading is required and students should be prepared to take a test on those works as soon as the term begins.
